




A remarkable \$400M

in critical state funding for rare and sensitive conservation lands was appropriated with the passage of the state budget, including implementation of the **Florida Wildlife Corridor Act,** supported by TNC.

12 UUU threatened

eastern indigo snakes were released at TNC's Apalachicola Bluffs and Ravines Preserve in year five of the 10-year program to support species recovery in north Florida, bringing the total released to 81.

TNC worked with local government and funding partners to launch several projects along south Florida shorelines to **improve coastal resilience.**

33 oyster reefs

are under construction to provide a home to oysters in the Pensacola region, in an effort to restore them to their historic range.





TNC engaged with policymakers to support **The Resilient Florida Bill**, which provides funding for resilience projects using nature to reduce the impacts of climate change and build a sustainable future for our state.



TNC and partners reached the **100,000 acres burned** milestone,

using prescribed fire to replicate natural processes and ensure healthy landscapes.

TNC's "Deck to Depth"

program launched to support the health of snapper and grouper fisheries, critical to recreational anglers and to healthy oceans, and essential to reaching our new Oceans and Coasts Network goals.

TNC **protected essential lands** across the state, including Ravensworth Farms, a 1,069-acre working cattle ranch in the biodiverse Lake Wales Ridge region, important habitat for the endangered Florida panther and black bear.
