

VSN STEWARDSHIP FUND (2023 - 2024)

Instructions and Application

Application Deadline: Friday, July 14, 2023

The Volunteer Stewardship Network (VSN) — a partnership between The Nature Conservancy and the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission — is a statewide program that supports, promotes and expands the role of volunteers and communities working to protect and manage native ecosystems, community gardens, parks, and other green space in Illinois, as well as supporting efforts that foster community connections to nature. Currently, more than 145 organizations belong to the VSN, including public agencies (e.g., forest preserve districts, conservation districts, park districts), private organizations (e.g., land trusts), and grassroots/community-based organizations (e.g., community gardens, affinity groups).

The VSN lends support to its members by providing stewardship tools and trainings and serves as a platform for groups to share information and resources. In addition to the VSN Stewardship Fund, specific support includes:

- **Gatherings Newsletter** A bi-monthly email newsletter to inform the stewardship community of new resources, upcoming events, funding opportunities, workshops, and news from across the state.
- **Network for Nature** The VSN hosts and sponsors virtual and in-person Network for Nature meetings and workshops to allow its members to share ideas, inspire collaboration, and learn new skills.
- Community Convening Fund Annual fund that provides support to organizations that foster
 community connections to nature and meaningfully engage Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC),
 LGBTIQA+, veterans and other groups that have not been prioritized in the past, in the programming of
 outdoor activities and care and protection of green space.
- VSN Scholarship Fund TNC works with several partners to host networking and training opportunities
 – i.e., Wild Things Conference, DEIJ workshops, and scholarships to attend courses through The
 Morton Arboretum at no cost.
- **Website Promotion** "Volunteer for Nature" Members may list their sites on an interactive map that helps potential volunteers find volunteer opportunities near home.

VSN Stewardship Fund

Each year, the Volunteer Stewardship Network dedicates funds to support volunteer and community organizations that care for natural areas and green space. Organizations may request stewardship tools and safety equipment and support for newsletters, websites, and educational materials. To make a request, please complete the questions on the attached application. **Requests should not exceed \$2000.**

Applications will be evaluated by the following criteria:

- ❖ Activity level of the VSN group
- Need could the request be satisfied by the landowner or another funding source?
- Urgency is something in imminent danger of being lost?
- Benefit to the natural resource and/or community
- Does it leverage other resources and funding?
- How well it fits in with the spirit of the VSN
- ❖ Items requested clearly match the needs of the organization

As you identify your needs, please keep in mind the funds awarded in 2023 - 2024 MUST be spent and receipts received by June 1, 2024.

You will be notified by August 1, 2023 if your funding request has been approved. If approved, you will receive a letter indicating the amount of funds available to your group. It is important to note that the money is not a grant (you will not receive the money in advance). Either you will be reimbursed in a timely way for expenses approved through this process or tools and supplies will be ordered and shipped to you directly.

Please note: The VSN is also providing support to organizations through the **Community Convening Fund (CCF)**. The goals of the CCF are to support people and nature by:

- funding projects that foster community connections to nature;
- meaningfully engage Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC), LGBTIQA+, veterans, and other
 communities that have not been prioritized in the past, in the programming, care and protection of
 green space;
- providing co-benefits for human and environmental health.

If your group is engaging BIPOC, LGBTIQA+, veterans and/or people with disabilities, and is in need of funding for trainings, expertise sharing, conferences/meetings, cultural and community building events, travel and transportation, or community development/research, please contact Brooke Thurau at brooke.thurau@tnc.org to request an application. VSN groups must complete a separate VSN Community Convening Fund application by Friday, July 14, 2023. *Groups may apply for both funds.
