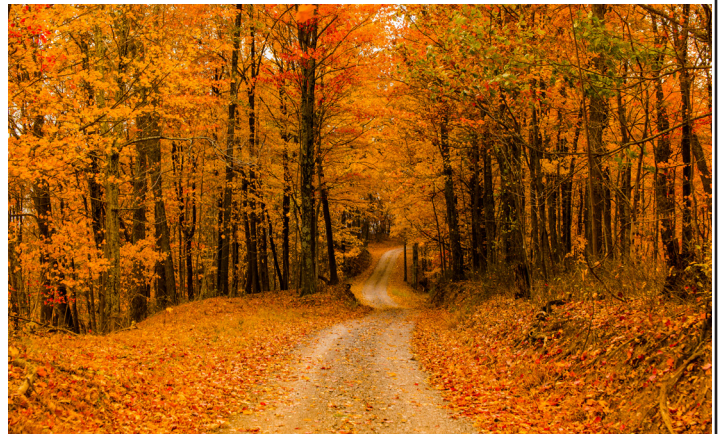
Leaf Print Activity

For this activity, you'll need:

- Sheets of plain white paper
- Fall leaves
- Crayons

Directions:

1. Gather up some leaves while out on a hike, in your backyard, or around the neighborhood. Ideally, you'll want to get a variety of shapes, sizes and types.
2. On a piece of plain white paper, position leaves in any pattern you like, and lay another sheet of white paper on top of the leaves.
3. Remove the paper wrapping from the crayons that you'll be using.
4. Turn a crayon on its side and gently rub over the top sheet of paper. You can make all kinds of prints with the same group of leaves, experimenting with different color combinations and different patterns.
5. For an added challenge, kids can look online or use a book to identify and label on their collage the different trees that the leaves they've collected came from.



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
